
SEDI "Cultural and Social Afternoon" to the City of York followed by


Option 1 York Minster Tours at 14.00 or 15.00

The Minster stands on a site where history has been made over the centuries. The Emperor Constantine began his progress to greatness here, and the foundations of the Roman buildings in which he lived can be seen under the central tower



York Minster is a worldfamous artistic and architectural masterpiece built between the 1220s and the 1470s and some would say it is 'the heart of Yorkshire'

You can see that Heart carved in the stone of the West window



When you have entered the Minster you will join our guided tour with one of the volunteer guides. Experience the beauty of the Quire and the Chapter House. Gaze from the top of the Central Tower, across the pinnacles and gargoyles of the Minster, looking out onto the medieval streets of historic York and to the countryside beyond. You can even take a tour of the new Glass Conservation Studio at Bedern Chapel. There is also a fantastic gift and book shop for a range of gifts to remind you of your visit in years to come.

Option 2 Jorvik Centre Tour at 14.00 or 16.00



The remains of 1,000 year old houses are revealed beneath your feet, objects taken from the excavations are explored and Viking-age timbers are brought before your eyes. New audio and video displays help you to investigate all of the information gathered from the 5-year long dig at Coppergate and piece together the jigsaw of where the Vikings came from, why they came here and how they lived and died.

At JORVIK Viking Centre you will be standing on the site of one of the most famous and astounding discoveries of modern archaeology. Between the years 1976-81 archaeologists from York Archaeological Trust revealed the houses, workshops and backyards of the Viking-Age city of Jorvik as it stood 1,000 years ago.
